



Memo. For magnetic resonance imaging (MRI)

No special preparation is required for magnetic resonance imaging.



Contraindications to magnetic resonance imaging:

- Any of the following devices, prostheses or foreign bodies in your body:
 - Heart stimulator or subcutaneous implantable heart defibrillator
 - Encephalic blood vessel staples or metal plates after neurosurgery
 - Metal staples in any other part of the body
 - Cerebrospinal fluid drain
 - Artificial heart valves or blood vessel implants (eg., filters, stents, catheters)
 - Eye or ear implants
 - Joint or limb implants
 - Tooth prostheses or metal teeth
 - Metal implants used to treat bone fractures or implanted after vertebral surgery
 - Bullets, metal chips and splinters
 - Loop (women only)
 - Other than the aforementioned electronic, metal, mechanical or magnetic implant
- Using:
 - Hearing aid
 - Contact lenses
 - Insulin, morphine or other medication pump
- Some neurosurgery
- Some laparoscopic surgery
- Eyes or other parts of the body injured by metal chips
- Claustrophobia
- Sensitivity to medicines or contraceptive substances
- Bronchial asthma, allergies, epilepsy, renal diseases or diabetes mellitus.
- Pregnancy (women only)
- Breast-feeding a baby (women only).
